**ALLEGATION(S)**

That an entry in the register relating to you has been fraudulently procured in that you failed to declare in your application for readmission dated 3<sup>rd</sup> March 2005 your police cautions and convictions as follows:

- a) Your conviction on 30<sup>th</sup> July 1979 at Brighton Magistrates' Court for 'Assault on Police'
- b) Your convictions on 11<sup>th</sup> December 1989 at Brighton Magistrates' Court for:

- (i) 'Possessing Controlled drug'
  - (ii) 'Possessing controlled drug with intent to supply'
  - (iii) 'Possessing controlled drug'
  - (iv) 'Supplying controlled drug'
- c) Your police cautions on 30<sup>th</sup> September 1997 for:
- (i) 'Possession of a class B drug – Cannabis Resin'
  - (ii) 'Possessing controlled drug – class B – Amphetamine'
- d) Your convictions on 23<sup>rd</sup> August 2002 at Wycombe and Beaconsfield Magistrates' Court for:
- (i) 'Possessing controlled drug – class B – Cannabis'
  - (ii) 'Cultivating Cannabis'
  - (iii) 'Possessing controlled drug – class B – Cannabis'
  - (iv) 'Possessing controlled drug – class A'
  - (v) 'Possessing controlled drug – class C'

## DECISION:

The Panel is satisfied that Mr Hockley failed to disclose the convictions referred to in the notice of allegation, that he did so knowingly and that accordingly his registration was obtained fraudulently. The Panel is unanimously of the opinion that the Registrar should be ordered to remove his name from the Register.

The Panel makes an interim suspension order under Article 31 of the Health Professions Order 2001 for a period of 18 months or until the earlier of (i) the expiry of the appeal period without an appeal being made, or (ii) (if an appeal is made) the determination of that appeal.

## RIGHT OF APPEAL

You may appeal against the Committee's decision and the order it has made against you.

Article 38 of the Health Professions Order 2001 provides that you have 28 days from the date that this notice was served on you to make such an appeal to the appropriate court. In this case the appropriate court is the High Court in England and Wales. The order set out above will not take effect until that appeal period has expired or, if you appeal during that period, until that appeal is withdrawn or disposed of.
